About starting school

When do children start school?

If you have a child born between **1 September 2009 and 31 August 2010**, they will be eligible for a full-time place in a Reception class from September 2014. This is a national offer for all children who have a birthday within these dates.

Does my child have to start school full-time?

Places in Reception will be allocated as full-time from September 2014. However if you wish to ask for part-time admission, **you must do so as soon as possible after receiving your notification of a place and before the end of the summer term 2014** by contacting the school. Please note that if you wish to combine a part-time school place with any other provider, your child's free entitlement will be used to pay for the school provision. There may therefore be an additional charge from the provider of any other care should the total equate to more than 15 hours per week.

What if I want my child to start school earlier than outlined above?

Children below compulsory school age or below the age for consideration for a Reception class place are entitled to free funded places for nursery education for up to 15 hours per week. This provision is quality assured and Ofsted inspected and would be expected to meet the individual needs for children including those who could be 'gifted and talented' or who have Special Educational Needs. Therefore these children would not be expected to start in school early.

Does my child have to start school in September 2014?

Compulsory school age starts at the beginning of the term after a child has their fifth birthday. You are entitled to defer your child's entry to school as detailed in the following table.

About starting school – information table

Child born	Compulsory school age
Between 1 September and 31 December 2009	From January 2015 You can defer the school place until January 2015 – the school place will be held for you once you let the school know.
Between 1 January and 31 March 2010	From April 2015 You can defer the school place until January 2015 or April 2015 – the school place will be held for you once you let the school know.
Between 1 April and 31 August 2010	<p>From September 2015 You can defer the school place until January 2015 or April 2015 – the school place will be held for you once you let the school know.</p> <p>You can also legally defer the school place until September 2015 BUT the offer of a school place will be withdrawn and you will need to reapply for a place in year one. This will be treated as a new application and you need to make this in the summer term 2015 and there is no guarantee that a place will be available at your preferred school.</p> <p>Please note that if you decided to request a place in a Reception class rather than year one in September 2015, having deferred the place for a year, this would be called delayed admission and can only be agreed by the school in consultation with the Local Authority and other professionals and is only likely in exceptional and extenuating circumstances. Please contact the Family Information Service or the School Admissions Team for advice.</p>

Applying for a school place

Who is responsible for admissions?

Cornwall Council co-ordinates applications for all state-funded schools in Cornwall using a process set out in the 'Co-ordinated Admissions Scheme' and described in this booklet. This includes local authority maintained schools and academies. Cornwall Council works in line with the School Admissions Code 2012. Each school has an 'admission authority' which sets the priority order they will use if there are more applications than places available – the 'oversubscription criteria'. Cornwall Council is the admission authority for community and voluntary-controlled schools. For foundation, trust and voluntary-aided schools the admission authority is the school's governing body and for academies it is the academy trust.

Why list more than one school preference?

The application form allows you to list up to three schools in order of preference. All of your preferences will be considered equally against each school's oversubscription criteria and if we are able to offer a place at more than one of your preferred schools we will offer a place at the one you have ranked highest. Naming a second or third preference does not give you any less chance of getting a place at your first preference school. If you don't name a second or third preference and we are not able to allocate a place at your preferred school then we will allocate a place at the nearest school with a place available.

Please be aware that 'expressing a preference' is not the same as 'choosing' a school. Whether or not your preference can be met depends on the availability of places and your priority for a place according to the oversubscription criteria.

Deciding your preferences

Before you make your decision regarding the school(s) you would prefer for your child, you may wish to visit several schools in order to find out more about them. You should contact the school(s) direct to arrange this. You could also have a look at the school's website or ask for a copy of their prospectus.

What about designated (catchment) areas?

Cornwall Council has divided the County into geographical areas called 'designated areas' which are each served by a specific school or schools. **Please note: your designated school will not always be the one nearest to your home address.**

Special arrangements apply in eight towns in the County where it has been agreed that a number of community and voluntary-controlled primary schools in the same town will be treated as if they have one designated area. These towns are: Camborne, Falmouth, Hayle, Helston, Saltash, St Austell, Truro and Wadebridge. (It should be noted though, that for parents living outside the designated town area in Camborne or St Austell, there will still be only one designated school for their address.)

In these towns, no one community or voluntary-controlled school will be designated in relation to your child's address, but in the event of a 'tie-breaker' being necessary to decide on admissions, your child would have priority for the designated school nearest to your home address.

If you want to identify the designated school(s) for your address, visit www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions or contact the School Admissions Team.

What are the advantages of choosing a designated school as one of my preferences?

In the oversubscription criteria for community and voluntary-controlled schools Cornwall Council gives priority to those parents who apply for a place for their child at a school serving the designated area in which they live. Please note that some voluntary-aided, foundation, trust or academy schools may not include designated areas in their oversubscription criteria. However, entitlement to transport to these schools will still be determined by Cornwall Council with regard to whether the school is in the designated area for your address or is your nearest school.

If your child attends a primary school that is not a designated school for your address, it is possible that your child will have a designated secondary school that is different from most of their classmates. This may mean that your child will not be able to transfer to the same secondary school as the majority of their friends.

If your application for a place at a primary school which is not your designated school is successful, there can be no guarantee that there would be places available for younger siblings at a later date. The oversubscription criteria for community and voluntary-controlled schools in Cornwall currently give priority to children living in the designated area above children who already have siblings attending the school.

What if I want a school outside Cornwall?

If you live in Cornwall you need to apply to Cornwall Council for your preferred school(s) even if one (or more) is not in Cornwall. Cornwall Council will ensure your application is forwarded to the appropriate local authority. You should also contact the school(s) for details of any additional information that they may require from you to determine your child's priority for admission, to be returned direct to them.

What do I do if I live outside Cornwall?

If you live outside Cornwall but you wish to apply for a school in Cornwall as one of your preferences, you should apply to your home local authority. They will ensure we receive a copy of your application. If you live overseas but are planning to move to Cornwall by September 2014 you can apply direct to Cornwall Council.

What if my child already attends an early years setting/nursery at my preferred school or I have registered an interest in a school – do I still need to apply?

Yes - places are not guaranteed on the basis of attending an early years setting/nursery or expressing an interest in a school - you must still complete an application for a place.

What is considered to be my child's 'home address'?

Each child may have one registered address only for the purposes of determining priority for admission and transport entitlement. This address should be the place where the child is normally resident. If there is shared residence of the child or a query is raised regarding the validity of an address, it may be necessary to use the address of the person receiving child benefit for the child. If this is inconclusive, the registered address would be considered to be the address at which the child spends the majority of days during the school week. **However, parents should settle any dispute prior to submitting only one application to Cornwall Council for each child.**

Fraudulent applications

As part of the process of ensuring that school places are allocated fairly, Cornwall Council undertakes address checks on a random sample of applications each year to ensure that information submitted by parents/carers is correct. If you are randomly selected you will receive a letter requesting evidence of your current address. Please bear in mind that if there is evidence that you have given fraudulent or misleading information as part of your application and if the correct information would have meant that you would have been refused a place at a particular school, the offer will be withdrawn.

Ready to apply?

Before 15 January 2014, visit www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions and complete your online application or complete and return the paper application form available on the website or from the School Admissions Team. Please note that if there is a dispute between parents and we receive more than one application for a child this could lead to a delay in a place being allocated. Disputes must be resolved as only one application for each child can be submitted and if more than one application is received, this will delay the process.

What additional information do I need to provide?

If you believe that you should be given priority based on a particular oversubscription criterion in the school's admission arrangements, please give as much relevant information as possible with your application to support this. Places can only be allocated using the written information that you give us. If you wish to send any supporting information after you have submitted your application we can only guarantee that it would be taken into account if it is received by the School Admissions Team by 14 February 2014, after which the allocation process will begin.

If one (or more) of your preferred schools is a Church school, you may also need to complete an extra form or provide additional evidence to help them determine your priority for a place under their oversubscription criteria. You should ask the school whether this is the case and provide the required information direct to the school.

What if I change my mind before the application deadline?

When applying online you can change your preference(s) right up to the deadline of 23:59 on 15 January 2014. However, please remember that if you edit your application, **it is essential that you resubmit it** – failure to do so will result in a non-application. If you have sent in a paper application form you will need to write to the School Admissions Team to tell them you want to change your preference(s). This must be received by 15 January 2014.

What if my application is late?

Applications submitted after the deadline of 23:59 on 15 January 2014 will not be processed until after all those applications submitted by the deadline. There will be some delay before a place can be allocated and it is possible that some schools will already be full. **Please note that you will not be able to use the online application system after the 15 January 2014 deadline – you will need to download a paper form from www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions.**

In exceptional circumstances, for example due to medical reasons, a recent move into the area or a family returning from abroad, an application may be accepted for consideration with those received by the deadline (15 January 2014) if it is received by 14 February 2014, after which the allocation process will begin. If you think this applies to your late application, please ensure that you attach a covering letter to your form explaining why your application is late.

What if I want/need to change schools during the school year?

If you want/need to change schools during the school year, you can apply to Cornwall Council using the In-Year Application Form available on the website: www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions or contact the School Admissions Team.

Fair Access Protocol

All local authorities are required to have a Fair Access Protocol which applies to all schools in their area. This document sets out how Cornwall Council and schools will ensure that, during the school year, any children without a school place can be offered a place at a suitable school as soon as possible, even if the school is full. To find out more about the Protocol, please visit www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions or contact the School Admissions Team.

Service families (UK Armed Forces)

During the school year, Cornwall Council will allocate a place ahead of the normal timescales for a service family arriving in Cornwall as long as the 'in-year' application is accompanied by an official letter that declares a relocation date and supplies the Unit postal address or quartering address. Contact the School Admissions Team for more information.

How places will be allocated

Allocation of applications submitted on time

If your application was submitted by the deadline of 23:59 on 15 January 2014 it will be considered at the same time as all other applications received by the deadline. No priority is given on a first-come, first-served basis.

All applicants will be listed in priority order for admission to each school, regardless of whether the school is named as a first, second or third preference. So if you name three preferences, your child will appear on three lists. We will offer places up to the published admission number (PAN) for each school i.e. the maximum number of children that a school will admit to a year group. If your child qualifies for a place at more than one of the schools you have expressed a preference for, a place will be offered at the one you have ranked as your highest preference on your application form – only one offer of a school place will be made for each child.

What if my application was late?

After the allocation of places for on-time applications, known as round one, i.e. those received by 15 January 2014, late applications will be dealt with as follows:

Late applications received before 2 May 2014

Any applications received between 15 January 2014 and 2 May 2014 but not considered to be exceptional will be dealt with together in round two and parents will be notified by 2 June 2014. Late applications or changes of mind submitted by 14 February 2014, after which the allocation process will begin, may be processed with those received by the deadline **only** in exceptional circumstances such as medical reasons, a recent move into the area, a return from abroad or other circumstances decided by Cornwall Council to be exceptional.

Late applications received after 2 May 2014

Applications received after 2 May 2014 until 31 August 2014 will be dealt with on a daily basis but only after the round two allocations have been made.

What is the order of priority?

Where there are more applications than there are places available, the school's oversubscription criteria will be used to determine the priority order for places. The oversubscription criteria used to decide on priority for places at a community or voluntary-controlled school are set out on the next page. The oversubscription criteria that apply to voluntary-aided, trust schools and academies are summarised in the individual schools list later in this booklet or in full at www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions.

Cornwall Council's Oversubscription Criteria for admission to community and voluntary-controlled primary schools

The following priority order will be used to decide which children should get any available places at community or voluntary-controlled primary schools if there are more applications than places available.

1. **Children in care and children who were in care** but ceased to be so because they were adopted, or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order, immediately after being in care.
2. **Children who live in the designated area** of the preferred school, or whose parents can provide evidence at the time of their application for a place, that by the beginning of the autumn term of the 2014/15 school year they will be living in the designated area of the preferred school.

If there are more designated area children wanting places at a school than there are places available, criteria 3 to 6 below will be used to decide which of these children should have priority for admission. If there are still places available after all the designated area children have been allocated places, criteria 3 to 6 will be used to decide which of the remaining children should have priority for any spare places.

3. **Children with an unequivocal professional recommendation** from a doctor, school medical officer or educational psychologist that non-placement at the preferred school would not be in the best interest of the child and that placement at the preferred school is essential. Written evidence must be sent to the School Admissions Team with the application form.
4. **Children with siblings** who will still be attending the preferred school at the time of their admission.

'Siblings' means brothers or sisters. They are defined as children with at least one natural or adoptive parent in common, living at the same or a different address. Children living permanently in the same household at the same address would also be counted as siblings, regardless of their actual relationship to each other. To qualify as a sibling a child must be on the roll of the school in question at the date of application, allocation and admission.
5. **Children of a parent who is a practicing Christian (applies to voluntary-controlled schools only)**. This will need to be evidenced by a letter from the Parish Priest or Minister.
6. **All other children.**

If the criteria outlined leave more children with an equal claim than places available, the following tie-breakers will be used:

(i) Children living in designated areas served by more than one school (dezoned areas) who wish to attend one of those schools

- (a) Where two or more children fulfil the same criterion, priority will be given in the first instance to those children for whom the preferred school is the nearest

designated school. Within this category, priority will be given to those children who live nearer to the preferred school.

(b) Priority would then be given to those children for whom the preferred school is not the nearest designated school, with priority being given to those children in this category who live nearer to the preferred school.

(ii) All other children

For children who do not come under (i) above, where two or more children fulfil the same criterion, priority will be given to the child who lives nearer to the preferred school.

(iii) Final tie-breaker

Should the tie-breakers above still leave children with an equal claim because distances are exactly the same, random allocation will be used to decide on priority. Cornwall Council's Random Allocation Protocol is available on request from the School Admissions Team.

Children of a parent who is a practicing Christian (priority 5)

'**Parent**' is any person who has parental responsibility or care of the child.

'**Christian**': A Christian church is any church which is a member of Churches Together.

'**Practicing Christian**': This will be subdivided and ranked accordingly in the following priority order and refers to a child or parent, who in the opinion of the Parish Priest/Minister:

- i. is at the heart of the church;
- ii. is attached to the church; or
- iii. is known to the church.

These will be defined as follows:

- i. An applicant '**at the heart of the church**' would be a regular worshipper, usually one who worships at least twice a month. To accommodate difficult patterns of work and family relationships account should be taken of week-day worship. The worshipper could be the child for whom application is made or one or both parents. Greatest priority will be given to these applicants.
- ii. An applicant '**attached to the church**' would be a regular but not frequent worshipper, by which is meant (for example) one who usually attends a monthly family or church parade service or is regularly involved in a weekday church activity including an element of worship.
- iii. An applicant '**known to the church**' would not be a frequent but probably an occasional worshipper, someone who is perhaps known through a family connection, or one or more of whose family would be involved in some church activity, such as a uniformed or other church organisation. In this context, 'family' means a parent or sibling.

Measuring distances

Home to school distances used for tie-breaking will be measured by a straight-line measurement as determined by CAPITA One and supported by Cornwall Council's Geographical Information System (dataMap). Measurements will be between your home address using Ordnance Survey's AddressPoint dataset (usually the centre of the main building of the property) and the main gate of the school (as determined by Cornwall Council).

Distances used to determine nearest school with room (i.e. where it is not possible to offer a place at a preferred school) and for establishing transport entitlements will be measured by the nearest available route as determined by Cornwall Council's Geographical Information System (dataMap).

After you have submitted your application

Will my application be acknowledged?

If you apply online you will receive an automated email response to let you know your application has been submitted successfully. Paper applications will not be acknowledged unless you include a stamped addressed envelope with your form.

When will I be told about the outcome of my application?

If you submit an online application by 23:59 on 15 January 2014 you will receive an email on 16 April 2014 in addition to a letter which will be sent by first class post on the same day. If you submit a paper application by 15 January 2014 we will send you a letter by first class post on 16 April 2014.

What do I do when I receive my notification?

You don't need to do anything unless you have changed your mind or your circumstances have changed, in which case you should contact the School Admissions Team for advice.

What happens if my child is not offered a place at my preferred school?

The letter will tell you whether you have been allocated a place at your second or third preference schools. If you did not name any other preferences or your other preference schools are also full, your child will be offered a place at the nearest school with room (measured as an actual distance by the nearest available route).

If you are not allocated a place at your preferred school you will have the right to appeal to an independent panel - the letter will tell you how to do this. You will have 20 school days after you receive your notification to appeal the decision. Appeals must then be heard within 40 school days of this deadline.

If your child has a Statement of Special Educational Needs, you will have the right of appeal to the Special Educational Needs and Disability Tribunal. However, in the first instance, you will be advised to contact the Assessment and Education Provision Team (Tel: 0300 1234 101).

When will appeal hearings take place?

By 20 May 2014:	Parents to submit appeals or requests for their children to remain on waiting lists (on-time applications)
June 2014:	Appeals will take place (mainly for on-time refusals)
July 2014:	Appeals will take place (mainly for round two refusals)
July/August 2014:	Appeals will take place (mainly for refusals after round two)

If my appeal is unsuccessful, can I appeal again?

You can only appeal again for a place in the same school within the same academic year if the admission authority for that school has accepted a further application because there has been a significant and material change in the circumstances of the parent or carer, child or school (e.g. a change of address into a school's designated area), but has determined that the new application must also be refused.

What about waiting lists?

Cornwall Council or the governing bodies of academies, voluntary-aided, foundation and trust schools will maintain waiting lists for at least the first term of the academic year of admission. The waiting list will be based on the school's oversubscription criteria and a child's place on a waiting list is subject to change according to additional information received about applications or children being added to the list – so their place on the list might move up or down. **No priority is given to the length of time that a child has been on the list.** Children in Care or children admitted through the Fair Access Protocol will be given priority over children on the waiting list.

What if I change my mind?

If you have been allocated a place at a school but then change your mind and wish to express a preference for a different school, please put your request in writing to the School Admissions Team. Please note that you would have to give up the allocated place and **your changed preference(s) would be processed as a late application** unless it is sent before 14 February 2014 (after which the allocation process will begin) and considered to be exceptional.

What if I change address before a place has been allocated?

If you change address before the allocation date of 16 April 2014, you should tell the School Admissions Team in writing. A change of address may affect your child's priority for a place at a school or your entitlement to transport. Address changes should be notified as soon as possible and all such notifications received by 14 February 2014 (after which the allocation process begins) will be taken into account when considering your child's priority for a place at a school. If you fail to notify

Cornwall Council of your change of address and you are allocated a place at an oversubscribed school on the basis of your previous address, **Cornwall Council reserves the right to withdraw that allocation.**

What if I change address after a place has been allocated?

If you change address after the allocation date of 16 April 2014, you should tell the School Admissions Team in writing. A change of address may affect your entitlement to transport. However, as long as your move takes place after the allocation date an allocated place would not be withdrawn if you wish to retain it.

Home to school transport

The responsibility for a child's attendance at school rests with parents/carers. This includes making the necessary arrangements for travel to school, including accompanying your child (or arranging suitable supervision) to and from school as necessary.

Cornwall Council provides transport free of charge to school in line with its duties under Section 508 and 509 of the Education Act 1996 and Schedule 35B inserted by the Education and Inspections Act 2006.

Please note that eligibility for transport to school is assessed separately from admission to school, and allocation of a school place should not be taken as an indication that transport will be provided.

The designated areas used to determine eligibility for transport to school are those defined by Cornwall Council and may occasionally differ from the designated areas used (if any) in an individual school or academy's admissions policy. To find out the designated school(s) for your address visit www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions or contact the School Admissions Team.

If you are in any doubt as to whether your child would be eligible for home to school transport, please contact the School Admissions Team to confirm before submitting your application.

Will my child be eligible for transport free of charge to school?

Provided transport is generally limited to those children attending their nearest primary school (or the designated school for your address if it is not the nearest) and living more than two miles away. Distances for transport purposes are measured using the shortest available walking route as determined by Cornwall Council.

However, transport will also be provided in some other circumstances, such as when a child's special educational needs or disability requires it, or if there are exceptional circumstances.

Please note that in September 2013 Cornwall Council will begin consultation on proposed changes to its Home to School Transport Policy for implementation in September 2014. You can find more details and the current and proposed Home to School Transport Policy at www.cornwall.gov.uk/schooltransport.

To enquire whether your child will be eligible for transport free of charge to school, please contact the School Admissions Team.

What if my preferred school is not the nearest or designated school?

If you are allocated a place at your preferred school and that school is not the nearest or designated school for your address, your child will not be eligible for transport to that school.

What if I apply for a place for my child at his or her nearest or designated school but he or she is offered a place elsewhere?

If you apply for a place for your child at your nearest (or designated) school but are not allocated a place because the school is full, you will be allocated a place at the school you named as your next preference, or at the nearest school with room if none of your preferences are available.

If the school at which your child is allocated a place is the nearest school to you with room, your child will be eligible for transport to school if it is more than two miles from your home address.

Sustainable travel to school

When you are thinking about the schools you would like your child to attend, it is important you consider the following:

Cornwall Council is fully committed to promoting walking, cycling, bus use (if available) and car sharing for the school journey. We would like as many children to walk and cycle to school as possible instead of being driven by their parents.

Children who walk to school are fitter, have better developed social skills, are more familiar with their surroundings, have better road sense and arrive at school more relaxed and ready to learn.

Walking, cycling or using the bus reduces congestion on the roads. Parents in Cornwall who drive their children to school increase congestion on the roads by 20% and generate approximately 4,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide, the principal cause of human induced climate change.

Unless the school your child attends is less than half a mile from your home you will probably drive your child to school. Walking, cycling and using public transport (if available) offers children independence and flexibility - which is especially important with greater numbers of pupils staying for extra study, extra curricular activities and sport.

Where walking, cycling or public transport are not feasible, car sharing may be the option. This can save time and money and helps cut traffic congestion and air pollution as well as being sociable for children. Car sharing can also reduce the costs for children whose families do not own a car.

Children with Special Educational Needs

If your child has Special Educational Needs (SEN) his/her school will initially assess and provide for them according to the Department for Education (DfE) Code of Practice. If your child has more complex SEN than can be provided for by the support available for pupils on the School's Record of Need, Cornwall Council will carry out a statutory assessment in line with the Education Act 1996. If you feel your child has SEN you should discuss this with the headteacher of your child's school. If your child is not yet at school, and you are concerned, please contact the Assessment and Education Provision Team.

The Assessment and Education Provision Team can give you detailed information about all aspects of provision for children with SEN, including statutory assessments and the Code of Practice.

Wherever possible, Cornwall Council aims to provide for children with SEN in mainstream schools. Cornwall Council has, however, four special schools and a number of area resource bases (ARBs) attached to mainstream schools to provide for children with more severe difficulties. All admissions to special schools are decided by admission panels. Placement at a special school outside Cornwall is also possible in exceptional cases where no appropriate provision is available in Cornwall. Education is also provided for children in hospital and for those who cannot attend school.

There is also a Parent Partnership Service that provides independent information and support to parents and carers who may have concerns about their child's SEN. The Parent Partners can help you make informed choices about your child's education. They can encourage closer working relationships between you, your child's school, Cornwall Council and other agencies.

Other information about schools

School meals

Meals are available for pupils to purchase at all schools in Cornwall. It is the parent/carer's responsibility to ensure that their children are provided with money to purchase these meals. Somebody Else's Child – Everybody's Responsibility

Cornwall Council is urging people in Cornwall to help them ensure the safety and wellbeing of children who are being cared for by someone who is not a direct relative.

Private fostering describes an arrangement when someone who is not a close relative (a close or direct relative is defined as stepparent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle or aunt - whether full blood, half blood or by marriage) cares for another person's child for 28 days or more. Although this is done by a private arrangement, legally the parent and the carer must notify the local authority where the child is going to live so that the local authority can ensure that the child is being properly looked after. Nobody knows exactly how many children are privately fostered and it is feared that some of these 'invisible' children could be at risk of abuse, or victims of trafficking. According to Government Statistics at 31 March 2012, 1,780 children were reported as being cared for and accommodated in private fostering arrangements in England.

The Council is therefore particularly asking parents and people who work with children to be aware of private fostering and to notify us immediately if they suspect such an arrangement. The general public also has a part to play.

All information you provide in connection with your application will be processed by Cornwall Council and may be shared by Cornwall Council with other relevant admission authorities (e.g. other local authorities, schools, etc.) for the purposes of dealing with your application and any related matters (e.g. appeals). In addition, the information you provide in connection with your application may be used for the purposes of dealing with matters connected with or ancillary to your child's education (e.g. school transport, school meals, etc.) or the purpose of updating any other records (e.g. social care, health records, etc.) which either the Council or the schools hold in relation to your child.

By completing and submitting your application you give your express consent that all personal data submitted by you may be processed by us in accordance with the above mentioned purposes.

The information you provide in connection with your application will be retained by Cornwall Council and/or the school at which your child is placed for the duration of your child's compulsory education.

You have a right to apply for a copy of the information we hold on you or your child and to correct any inaccuracies. In addition, in the event that you no longer wish us to process the information for the purpose(s) provided you may withdraw your consent at any time by giving us written notice. You should understand, however, that we may

nevertheless need to continue processing your personal information in accordance with our statutory obligations to the extent permitted by law.

Glossary

Academies are publicly-funded schools which are independent from the local authority. The governing body sets the admission arrangements but parents/carers still apply to the local authority for a place at the school.

Admission arrangements are the overall procedures, practices and oversubscription criteria used in deciding the allocation of school places including any device or means used to determine whether a school place is to be offered. Admission arrangements are set by the admission authority.

Admission authority is the body responsible for setting and applying a school's admission arrangements. For community and voluntary-controlled schools this body is Cornwall Council. For foundation, trust, voluntary-aided or academy schools it is the governing body or academy trust.

Community schools are maintained by the local authority which sets the admission arrangements.

Co-ordinated admission scheme is the process by which local authorities co-ordinate the allocation of places for schools in the area.

Designated area is a geographical area from which children may be afforded priority for admission to a particular school. A designated area is part of a school's admission arrangements and must therefore be consulted upon, determined and published in the same way as other admission arrangements.

Foundation schools are maintained by the local authority and the governing body sets the admission arrangements.

Free schools are publicly-funded schools which are independent from the local authority. Free schools have a similar legal status to academies. Parents/carers still apply to the local authority for a place at the school.

Oversubscribed is where a school has a higher number of applicants than there are places available at the school, which is dictated by the school's published admission number.

Oversubscription criteria refers to the published criteria that an admission authority applies when a school has more applications than places available in order to decide which children will be allocated a place. The oversubscription criteria must be set within the law on admissions.

Published admission number (PAN) is the maximum number of children that a school will admit to each year group. The number depends on the amount and type of accommodation available at the school and is worked out using instructions set out by the Department for Education. It is agreed before the admissions process begins and normally the school will not offer more places than this number.

Special Educational Needs (SEN) statement is a statement made by Cornwall Council under Section 324 of the Education Act 1996, specifying the special educational provision required for that child. This could include a particular school where it is believed that the child would be best placed.

Trust schools are a type of foundation school which forms a charitable trust with outside partners. **Co-operative trust schools** are a model of trust which includes the Co-operative Society as a member.

Voluntary-aided (VA) schools are maintained by the local authority and the governing body sets the admission arrangements.

Voluntary-controlled (VC) schools are maintained by the local authority which sets the admission arrangements.
