Mrs Trout's gardening club.

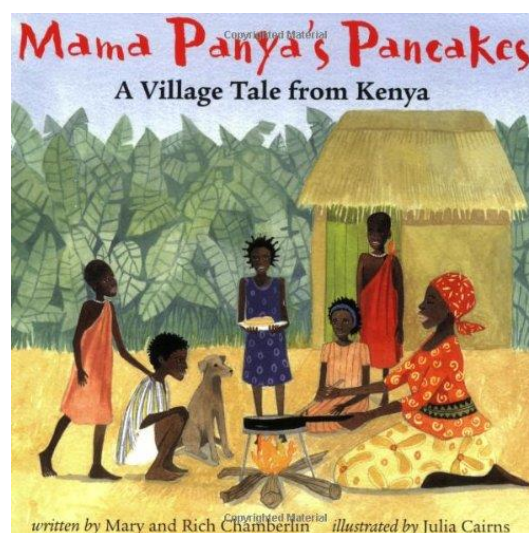
Wednesday:
